Templeton Fellowships Contest, an international essay competition open to college students and untenured college teachers under 36 years of age. The top three contestants in the two divisions will be awarded cash prizes for outstanding essays on the following topic:

Student Division

First Prize: \$2,500 Second Prize: \$1,500 Third Prize: \$1,000

Junior Faculty Division

First Prize: \$10,000 Second Prize: \$5,000 Third Prize: \$1,500

In addition to the cash prizes, winners will receive assistance in getting their articles published and two-year subscriptions to The Independent Review. The deadline is May 1, 2009.
