It's quite telling when you look at the difference in language and tone that Federal Treasurer Wayne Swan uses against rich miners who are able to afford full page newspaper advertisements to get their point across, compared to taxpayer subsidised environmental activist groups like Greenpeace who are able to do exactly the same thing ("Greenpeace rejects Swan's attack over coal", Sydney Morning Herald, March 7).
